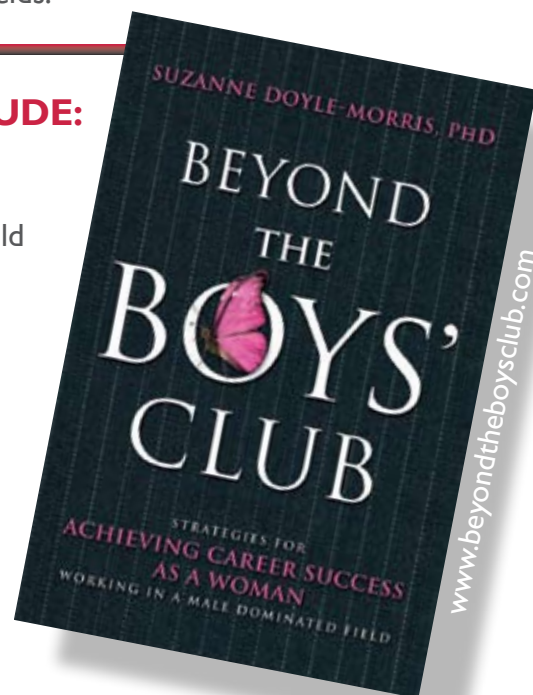
#### **Beyond the Boys' Club**
